Summary: Repairs damaged bodies and body parts of automotive vehicles such as automobiles, buses, and light trucks by performing the following duties.

Body Shop Duties:

- Asses damage to vehicles when involved in a wreck
- Tear down the vehicle when needed
- Repair sheet metal on vehicles
- Bondo and primer repairs
- Replace damaged parts
- Welding sheet metal
- Frame work and alignment of parts
- Bumper repair
- Plastic welding and repair

Paint Shop Duties:

- Make small repairs (dents and chips)
- Sand and masking repaired parts as needed
- Buff out repairs as needed
- Mix paint colors and tinting to match vehicle being repaired
- Spray booth operations, applying primers, sealers clear coat and blending
- Clean and prepare products to be painted or coated
- Clean and maintain tools, equipment and work areas
